

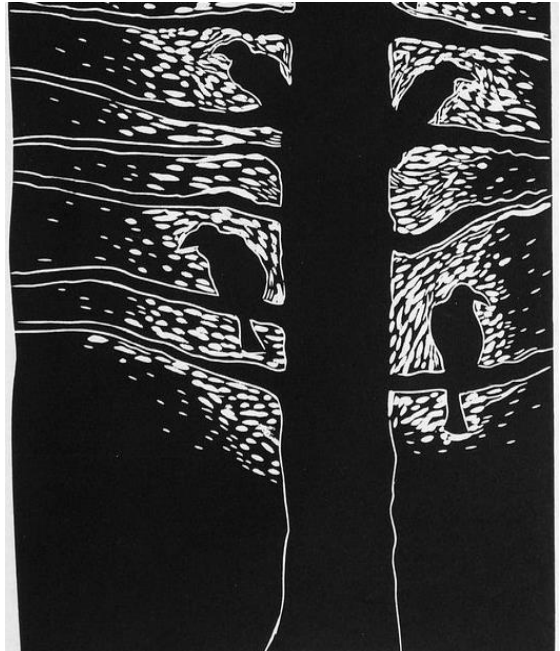
How Many Birds Left?
