After today, "Crazy Cats" will be given to a family receiving the services of The Family Place, a day shelter in St. Paul. Church families participating in today's Celebration of New Lives receive a card with a picture of the quilt.

Evergreen Quilters also sell their handmade quilted and sewn items to earn money for programs at The Family Place, the Jeremiah Program, and others that provide food and meals to homeless and hungry people in St. Paul. One hundred percent of the money raised by our group's sales, biennial silent auction, and quilt raffle is donated to these organizations.
