Unitarian Universalist White Supremacy Teach-In

Unitarian Universalism is changing. We are striving to redeem our history by working to become a far more inclusive, anti-racist, multi-cultural community than we are today. In hope of helping us take one more step, we are joining more than two hundred Unitarian Universalist congregations across the country in offering a teach-in about white privilege, white fragility and what we mean when we talk about white supremacy. This call to reflection comes from many in our movement, including the UUA Board of Trustees, Black Lives UU, the Minister's Association, and more. Two Teach-Ins have been scheduled: Wednesday, May 3, 7:15-8:30 p.m., and Saturday, May 6, 1:30-4:30 p.m. Childcare will be provided at both events.
