

Georgia passed away peacefully at the age of 94 at Alton Memory Care in St. Paul. She was predeceased by her parents, Philip L. & Berenice S. Ray as well as her husband, Albert W. Lindeke, Jr. She is survived by her sister, Patricia Ray Saunders of Minneapolis and three children from her first marriage; Alida DeCoster (Perry Beider), Donald DeCoster and Claire DeCoster; grandsons Nathan DeCoster (Gail) and Louis Beider, and two great grandchildren. She is also survived by her Lindeke stepchildren and numerous nieces, nephews and friends. Georgia's great granddaughter and namesake, Collins "Coco" Georgia DeCoster, was born on June 23, 2021.

Georgia had an active volunteer and professional life, was a recognized leader in historic preservation, chaired the Historic Sites Committee of the city of St. Paul, was appointed executive director of the Bicentennial Commission and was a founding director of Minnesota Landmarks. She received an award from the Minnesota Architects Association and was honored in Washington, DC, for her contributions in preservation. She wrote and published extensively about St. Paul author Grace Flandrau.
