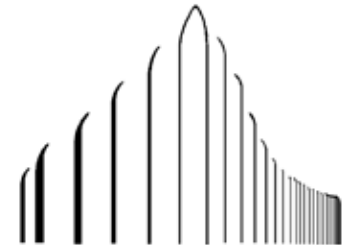

Rev. Jim Bear Jacobs (Mohican) serves as Director of Racial Justice for the Minnesota Council of Churches. He is the founder and leader of the Sacred Sites Tours, in which participants visit several local sacred sites of the Dakota people and learn Minnesota history from a Native perspective through storytelling and by reverently experiencing the sacred sites in silence and reflection.

She lives in the Little Bohemia neighborhood of St. Paul (down the hill) with her husband, Matt Brown.

Ina Yukka (Iná= mother in Dakota language, Yukka= son in Aymara language) is a mother and son duet that performs indigenous traditional music from South America and the New Song Movement. By combining the sounds of wooden flutes, strings, native drum, and their beautiful vocal harmonies, Vladimir Garrido and Nia Biagetti bring to the Twin Cities their love for music and family, peace and justice... and of course... a respect for Mother Earth and a call for unity and understanding.
