This Week in Religious Education

Spirit Play (ages 3-6) children step into this season of life's renewal by considering the life cycle of a frog. How does a tadpole know when it's time to become a frog? How might the tadpole feel about losing its tale? How might the frog think about change? What changes more, a frog or a child? Please wonder together with your children about their sacred play.

Rotations (grades 1-6) children begin with worship in Ames Chapel, then in classrooms explore the theme of "Sacred Community" which celebrates and affirms many different types of families, held together in the embrace of love.

Middle School (grades 6-8) youth continue their second semester class on "Building the Beloved Community." Youth conclude each class with worship in Ames Chapel.
